SAQ 2020 State Harness and Hacking Championships

Blue skies greeted competitors at SAQ's 14th State Harness and Hacking Championships and Track to Hack Final held at Gatton Showground over the weekend of 19th & 20th September 2020.

Despite the challenges faced by everyone this year, almost 50 enthusiastic competitors and their supporters attended the weekend, with the presentation of both horses and their handlers being top quality. SAQ thanks our sponsors, particularly the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission Equine Welfare Program, for helping us to continue to offer a showcase for Standardbreds, their temperament and versatility.

Day 1, Saturday 19th September was a full day starting with led events including classes for horses still racing, Fashions on the Field (handler in race day finery), followed by SAQ Adoption horse led and ridden classes.

After a short lunch break harness classes commenced with racing gigs, competitive and pleasure carts competing in a variety of classes culminating in a barrel race.

Winners on Saturday: - Supreme Champion Led Standardbred -Itsasunrise (Alex Cain), Supreme Champion Led & Ridden Adoption Standardbred - Usane Flash (Daryl Harrip) and Supreme Champion Harness Standardbred - Everydays A Sunday (Felicity Reinke).

Saturday evening's highlight was the Track to Hack Final, held under lights at the indoor arena. The final demonstrated the skill of each team, with each rider to be commended on both their presentation and performance of themselves and their horse.

Sunday 20th September was another beautiful day with ridden classes being the focus of the day. There were opportunities for all levels of rider, with Supreme Ridden Hack, won by Felicity Reinke on Everydays A Sunday, rounding out the day.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

The year of 2020 is drawing to a close and although it will not go down in history as one of the best years, it will be memorable.

With the uncertainty of Covid-19 the planned equestrian calendar for all horse breeds and sports was thrown into disarray. Then with the easing of restrictions at the end of July SAQ then went on to run its three major events for the year in three months. With hindsight this was probably overambitious, but with a lot of hard work by the committee we managed it. So, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the committee for all their hard work this year.

Moving forward I believe there will be permanent changes in the way society interacts due to the Covid-19 pandemic. But you cannot keep a good horse person down, we will cope, and we will adapt. We did it for Hendra, we did it for E.I. and we will do it for Covid-19.

During 2020 SAQ had some major achievements. Firstly, we secured home grounds at Marburg Showgrounds. Then we had a 70 x 30mtr arena constructed on site as well as refurbishing the old Pony Club shed including installing electricity. This is a major boost to SAQ running events and clinics as we now do not have to book a venue and we have somewhere to store the SAQ equipment.

One of the good things to come out of the Covid-19 shutdown was the increased use of electronic media by equestrian groups. So even myself as an aged mare has learned to use Zoom and Teams, and I believe it can be an ongoing resource to connect people over time and distance. We also ran the Track to Hack competition via a video submission and I believe that we should continue to offer some video competition in the future to allow participation in SAQ events to all of Queensland, not just those that can travel to the South East corner.

We are holding our annual awards and AGM at the new clubhouse at Marburg on 7th November 2020. All are welcome.

So, in conclusion, for the last part of 2020, stay safe and hug your horse.

20 Qld Standardbred Track to Hack series promotes Standardbreds as P

The 2020 Qld Standardbred Track to Hack series promotes Standardbreds as Pleasure Horses upon their retirement from their traditional role of Harness Racing. 2020 saw the fourth series of its kind run in Queensland which focuses on the transition made from Harness Racing into Show Horse for retiring Standardbred's.

The series has been successfully running for the past 5 years in the Standardbred Pleasure and Performance Associations across the country, with full support from each state's Racing Board, and Queensland are proud to be a part of this inaugural series, thanks to the support of our Major Sponsors, Racing Queensland and Hygain.

This series is designed to help promote the Standardbred as a successful and athletic horse that can excel in a variety of performance and show disciplines and creates opportunities for an alternative lifestyle outside of racing.

After all 8 qualifying Agricultural Shows throughout the 2020 Queensland Show Season were cancelled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, The SAQ Events Committee co-ordinated Individual Video Entries to replace these shows so that combinations could still qualify for the finals. Although our numbers were down somewhat this year due to the pandemic, The Standardbred Association Queensland Inc were extremely proud to be able to present the 2020 Queensland Standardbred Track to Hack Series Final during these uncertain times, especially when many equestrian events were cancelled throughout Australia during 2020.

We would like to thank our 2020 Qld Standardbred Track to Hack Sponsors – Racing Qld and Hygain, who were eager to support this concept in Qld once again this year.

Racing Queensland is very supportive of the SAQ Standardbred Horse Adoption Program, and supports the placement of retired Standardbred racehorses in second careers through the SAQ Standardbred Horse Adoption Program.

The 2020 series was open to any Standardbred registered with Harness Racing Australia or New Zealand and was originally bred for the purpose of Harness Racing.

To be eligible to compete in the QLD Standardbred Track to Hack Series, all horses are required to be 3 years and over. Horse and owner/exhibitor must reside in Queensland for the QLD Series and have done so for minimum of 3 months.

Initially it was intended that Separate Standardbred Track to Hack Qualifying Classes for Queensland Entrants would be run at 8 nominated Agricultural Shows throughout the 2020 show season, however, all 2020 Qld Agricultural Show were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The SAQ Events Committee set up Online Video Entries to replace cancelled Qualifying Shows. Judging was done by a panel of 3 judges, combining both a designated led and a ridden workout. The judging panel awarded a Champion for each of the 8 Online Video opportunities. There was strict criteria for the workouts, including demonstrating a balanced trot and the Canter gait with correct leads. Only scores of above 85% were considered, which enabled only well-educated combinations entry to the finals. A number of horses entered the series but did not qualify for the finals due to lower scores. These combination were provided constructive feedback and encouraged to continue their training with the hope of trying again next series in 2021.

All Champion winners automatically qualified for the Final at the end of the series within QLD.

A total of 7 horses qualified for the finals this year, but unfortunately two horses were scratched prior to the finals. Hopefully we will see these combinations at our 2021 Series and Final!

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS - DUE NOW!

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Membership with SAQ runs from the 1st of October to the following 30th of September of a given year. If you need to renew your SAQ Membership, a renewal form is included later in this newsletter.

SAQ Membership is classified as one of the following categories:

JUNIOR MEMBER – a child under 18 years of age. A Junior member is eligible to register a gelding, filly or mare in their name and to participate in the SAQ Annual Awards and National High Point Competition, but is not eligible to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

SINGLE MEMBER – a person 18 years or older. A Single member is eligible to register a horse in their name, participate in the SAQ Annual Awards and National High Point Competition, nominate for Committee membership and to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP – parents/partners and children (by birth, legally adopted, legally fostered) residing at the same address and where the child / children are under the age of 18 years. A Family can register horses in the family or individual name, participate in the SAQ awards and National High Points Competition, nominate adult family members to the Committee and have two (2) votes on issues pertaining to the running of the Association. Members of a family who are 18 years or over, either living at home or residing elsewhere, must secure individual membership(s) in order to register a horse in their name, purchase a Performance Card, nominate for Committee membership and to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

ASSOCIATE MEMBER – a person who wishes to join the SAQ as a means of supporting the work of the Association but who does not wish to register a horse, participate in the SAQ Annual Awards or National High Point Competition.

An Associate Member is also not eligible to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association. However, an Associate Member is allowed to participate at two (2) SAQ events for the price of a member and is insured for these events with the SAQ.

- Volunteer Co-Ordinator
- Newsletter Editor
- Merchandising Officer
- □ Risk Management/Safety Officer
- □ Grants/Fundraising Officer
- Public Relations Officer
- □ Web Site Manager

Committee Members Tenure and Elections

Committee Members hold their positions until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting following the date of their election. They are eligible for re-election. In the event of a vacancy in the Committee, the Committee may appoint a Member to fill the vacancy until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

Nominations for election for a Committee position may be delivered to the Secretary from the date of distribution of the annual general meeting agenda until the annual general meeting.

A Committee position becomes vacant if the Committee Member resigns from office, is absent from all Committee Meetings for an unreasonable period of time without leave of absence, or if the position is declared vacant by a resolution at a Club General Meeting.

The estimated time commitment required for Newsletter Editor is approximately 1 - 2 hours per week.

Merchandising Officer

The Merchandising Officer is responsible for:

- D Maximising the revenue and sales of club related clothing, apparel and merchandise sold each year
- □ Holding and maintaining all SAQ merchandise
- Liaising with SAQ Committee with regards to purchases and sales of SAQ merchandise
- Maintaining the SAQ Merchandising Records
- □ Sourcing quotations and prices from relevant suppliers
- Review the apparel, clothing and merchandise sold by the club in previous years, ensuring its suitability for the upcoming year
- □ Finalise range of apparel, clothing and merchandise for the upcoming season
- Provide the committee with the recommendations for all apparel, clothing and merchandise for the coming season
- Liaise with the President and Committee to ensure apparel, clothing and merchandise reflect the current opinions and nature of club members
- Work with the Club Treasurer to accurately set apparel, clothing and merchandise sales targets which will be reflected in the club's budget

SAQ Ridden Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest accumulation of Ridden Class points from the 2019/2020 Show Season – includes all Ridden Hack classes.

SAQ Best Presented Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Show Season - Best Presented and Smartest on Parade Classes.

<mark>SAQ Harness Standardbred of the Year</mark> (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Show Season – includes all Harness classes/events.

SAQ Dressage Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Competition Season - includes all Dressage Classes for Standardbreds only and/or Open/All Breeds including Attendance Points.

SAQ Showjumping Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Competition Season – includes all Showjumping Classes for Standardbreds only and/or Open/All Breeds including Attendance Points.

SAQ Pony Club Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points for all Pony Club events, where you are required to be a member of a Pony Club to participate, including Attendance Points. If an event is conducted by a Pony Club but open to anyone, these points do not apply, but are awarded in other categories.

<mark>SAQ Endurance Standardbred of the Year</mark> (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Standardbred with the highest combined points for all Endurance Events, including Attendance Points.

SAQ Partbred Standardbred of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Partbred Standardbred with the highest points from the 2019/2020 Competition Season – for all events including Shows, Dressage and Showjumping, and Attendance Points.

SAQ Newcomer Exhibitor of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the competitor with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Show Season – includes all Led and Ridden Classes. Newcomer exhibitor is defined as a person that has competed less than 4 times previously in Standardbred Classes in either led or ridden classes. Experienced exhibitors cannot enter this class even with a newcomer horse.



SAQ STATE NHIGH POINT AWARDS

SAQ Newcomer Horse of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the Newcomer Horse with the highest combined points from the 2019/2020 Show Season – includes all Led and Ridden classes. Newcomer horse is defined as a horse that has competed less than 4 times previously in Standardbred Classes in either led or ridden classes. This event cannot be contested with a horse that has previously competed more than four shows (even with previous owner) in Standardbred Classes. There are no restrictions on the exhibitors' experience.

Presidents Encouragement Award (Award – Trophy) Encouragement award chosen and awarded by the President of the SAQ.

Ambassador Award (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the member who the SAQ Committee feels has represented the breed to a high degree or caliber in open competition.

Excellence in Achievement of the Year (Award – Trophy) Awarded to a SAQ member who has demonstrated success achieved outside of the above criteria. Achievements do not necessarily need to be in competition. This award is only awarded if a member has been identified as deserving the acknowledgement of their efforts with Standardbreds within our membership base, this award, if given, will be voted by the full SAQ Committee.

Adoption Horse of the Year (Award – Trophy) this award is chosen by the SAQ Committee. Achievements do not necessarily need to be in competition.

Attendance Award – (Award – Trophy) Awarded to the SAQ Member with the highest combined Attendance Points across all disciplines.

What are the SAQ State High Point Awards?

The SAQ State High Point Awards are designed to encourage members to compete with their Standardbreds in public competitions and exhibitions. These awards are designed to recognise those who help place Standardbreds before the public, as well as those who win awards with their Standardbreds.

Competitors accrue points towards End of Year awards. The majority of SAQ events are showing, and as such the majority of our awards are reflective of this, but even if you are not interested in the showing aspect, we still want to celebrate and congratulate you, by offering a variety of awards across all disciplines.

The 2019-2020 Season sees the introduction of a new system for point submission. Rather than submitting a point sheet for each show, competitors will have one performance card for each discipline, which they record results from the shows/events they attend with their Standardbred. Performance cards are available for download on the SAQ website. There are 8 performance cards; Showing (Purebred Standardbred and Partbred Standardbred), Dressage, Harness, Showjumping, Endurance, Pony Club and Other Discipline.

Standardbred Showing Performance Card

For all Showing events, including Ag Shows and SAQ State Hacking & Harness Championships. Points from shows will go towards Led, Ridden, Best Presented and Show and Versatile Standardbred of the Year Awards.

Partbred Standardbred Performance Card

For all Events, including Agricultural Shows and SAQ State Hacking & Harness Championships, Dressage and Showjumping.

Standardbred Harness Performance Card

For all harness competitions.

Standardbred Dressage Performance Card

For all dressage competitions. Training days, lessons or clinics are not eligible for points.

Standardbred Showjumping Performance Card

For all showjumping competitions.

Standardbred Endurance Performance Card

For all Endurance and competitive navigation rides. Points are given per kilometer completed, with additional points for passing vet check upon completion.

Standardbred Pony Club Performance Card

For all Pony Club events, including rallies, which are open to only Pony Club members (must also be SAQ Members) are to be put in the Pony Club Card. Non Pony Club members who compete in a competition hosted by a Pony Club, which is not restricted to just members, are to put their results in that disciplines card. E.g. an open Showjumping Day, attended by a Non-Member goes into the Showjumping Card, but a Pony Club member who attends that show could put it in either the Pony Club card OR the showjumping card— it cannot go in both.

Standardbred Other Discipline(S) Performance Card

For disciplines that do not have a specific card. Disciplines placed in this card will most likely not have their own awards, but all points collected will go towards the Versatile HOTY, and may have a bearing on Achievement, and Ambassador awards. Training days are not eligible for points.

How to Participate?

Participating in the SAQ State High Point Awards is now easier than ever before with the new submission system. Simply take your Standardbred to any event, participate, and record your results and points in the applicable Performance Card. You are not restricted to just SAQ events, any event is eligible for points. The SAQ State High Points is FREE to all members.

Criteria.

- 1. Participant must be a financial SAQ Member at the time of the individual competition entered onto the Performance card. Points cannot be backdated. If you submit points from July, but did not join/renew your membership until August, points from show(s) prior to joining/re-joining will be stripped. Those found to be doing this intentionally, may find themselves banned entirely from that season's competition awards, and anyone found cheating and falsifying points will also have all their points stripped, and subsequent bans from participating in the future season(s).
- The dates for Events eligible for Points, are 1st October 2019 to 3oth September, 2020. If you compete your horse within these dates, then you are eligible to submit points. Performance Cards must be submitted to the Points Officer quarterly, by the end of December, March and June and then the original Performance Cards must be received by last mail Monday 5th October, 2020 – No Exceptions.
- 3. Only SAQ Performance Cards will be accepted as proof of attendance no other form of correspondence will be accepted. Performance Cards can be downloaded from our Web Site <u>www.saq.com.au</u> under forms.
- 4. Only one horse to be entered per Performance Card.
- 5. Awards will be presented at our AGM and Awards night held in October/November 2020.

Point Calculation.

- Attendance Points; One day = one lot of attendance points, no matter how many classes, rings or disciplines you compete in on that day. A three day event is only eligible for 1 set of attendance points, even if you compete over 3 separate days.
- 2. Different disciplines have different allocation of points for placings / completion etc. These point schedules are listed on each performance card.
