RE-TRAINING YOUR OFF THE TRACK STANDARDBRED CLINIC **WITH KATE FENNER**

On the weekend of 10th & 11th October, the SAQ were delighted to run our "Re-training Your Off-the-track Standardbred Clinic" at Walloon Indoor Arena.

This 2-day clinic was designed to help owners re-train and prepare their off-the-track Racehorses for pleasure riding. Standardbreds have some special requirements when it comes to pleasure riding as their training for racing is very different. This clinic addressed many of those special needs, thus producing more confident horses and riders by the end of the weekend.






RE-TRAINING YOUR OFF THE TRACK STANDARDBRED CLINIC **WITH KATE FENNER**

During Day 2 we worked on Long-reining, which is a very useful training tool, as it's a great place to improve your horse's selfcarriage, build its top-line muscle and work on transitions, as well as an opportunity to observe the horse's temperament and movement prior to hopping into the saddle.

The feedback we received from all participants was that they all felt they have learnt invaluable skills that they can continue to use in their everyday training with their horses.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Presidents Report AGM 7th November 2020

Firstly, I would like to thank all the SAQ committee members and volunteers through this year that have helped in the enormous task of running SAQ. Without their hard work and dedication, a lot of the achievements of this year would not have happened. This has been a particularly hard year with the Covid-19 shutdown restrictions. The restrictions on equestrian events have seen some groups not hold any competitions or events this year. So, at the start of July in 2020 Queensland equestrian events were still in total shutdown. Then came the announcement from the Queensland government that restrictions were easing at the end of July.

Then the intrepid events committee scheduled our three State events four weeks apart, two of them on the brandnew venue of our new grounds at Marburg. In hindsight this was a mammoth task to take on with a lot of unknowns due to Covid-19. However, we managed to pull it off, with a few lessons learned and a few more grey hairs earned.

The year 2020 has been a year of challenges but for SAQ it has also been a year of achievements. We have established a clubhouse and grounds at Marburg, we have constructed and put to good use a 30 x 70 metre fenced arena, and we have been successful in applications for 3 grants with the QRIC RAW grants.

I would like to give a shout out to the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission for their support of SAQ and for the support of horse welfare for off the track Standardbred horses. Utilising the grants from QRIC has allowed us to run the three State events and a Kate Fenner Clinic for retraining OTT racehorses.

WILLIAM HILL MEMORIAL AWARD FOR ADOPTION HORSE OF THE YEAR

SAQ was also fortunate this year to receive a gift from the estate of Mr William Paul Hill, known as Bill. Bill was a Standardbred breeder that first started breeding horses around 1997.

This started out as a hobby and his love of racing and betting saw him breed some great horses and winners. His grandfather raced horses when they lived in Gatton and his father was a jockey. His sister Jeanne thinks this may be where the love of horses comes from.

His eldest brother also bred and raced Quarter Horses. Bill's pride and joy was a filly called Save Me Christian, who came into his life when he needed a little help coping. She gave him purpose and meaning.

Bill never missed a Saturday night at the Albion trots and studied the form guide religiously.

Bill and I share the trait that we both love to talk, especially about horses and one could be stuck on the phone for hours as he talked about them.

Bill left a bequest in his will that if any of the horses he bred won the Queensland Breeders Bonus when racing that it was to be donated to SAQ to help Standardbred horses. A couple of weeks ago SAQ were contacted by Queensland Harness Racing to let us know that one of Bill's horses had won a bonus and the payment of \$1000 would be directed to SAQ.

In recognition of this generous gift SAQ is renaming the annual high point award that we give for horses that have re-homed through our adoption program for Bill. So, from now on this award will be known as the William Hill Memorial Award for Adoption Horse of the Year.

Funds from Bill's gift will be directed to placement or training of off the track Standardbreds.

Presidents Report AGM 7th November 2020 (continued)

In November 2019 there was a parliamentary enquiry into the treatment of horses finishing racing and their treatment at slaughterhouses, to which myself and our horse welfare officer Melissa were invited to participate. This forum resulted in a plan to form a government section to monitor and administer the fate of horses finished racing. This department was to be up and running by June 2020. Unfortunately, the Covid-19 restrictions and then the government stand down due to the election have delayed this.

I would like to assure SAQ members that the committee are keeping in contact with QRIC and Queensland Racing, and will update you with how this program will work and what protections is gives all off the track horses. As part of the protections put in place QRIC now have a reporting hotline, with the slogan if you see something, say something. So, if you have any information about serious misconduct in racing or the mistreatment of racing animals within the sport, contact the Racing Report line on 1300 119 291 or Crime Stoppers on their toll-free number 1800 333 000. This can be anonymous if needed but be assured every complaint is logged and investigated.

The last thing I wanted to mention was our end of year high point awards and the national high point competition. I know that many of our members are out there competing with Standardbreds and SAQ want to recognise them. I want encourage members to fill out and submit the performance cards for the end of year trophies as there were 3 awards that we didn't give out this year because no cards were submitted for them.

Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, this year we had access to competing online by video. We have had a request from the other state groups to consider whether we make the National High Point competition online. This would mean that the competitors would be judged on a video submission to establish State Finalists and then all judged against each other in the final to truly give a national winner. I think this is a good idea as it would not require travel to a specific show on a specific date and hopefully encourage more entries. Please give feedback to the SAQ committee on this idea, so that when we meet with the other States, we know what Queenslanders want.

In conclusion, I hope all the members, friends and supporters survived the year that was 2020. I wish everyone a safe and happy break over Christmas, and I look forward to welcoming you all back in 2021.

SAQ MUSTERS

17th October 2020 & 14th November 2020

The new arena provided ample space for participants and the outside grassy area was also great for participant activities. The canteen was in full swing and also had a few trainers stop in for a chat and something to eat. There were 14 riders on the day and many spectators who came down to see what it's all about.

We had a few more riders and spectators at our November muster and we started at the earlier time of 8am to combat the warmer weather.

The muster activities were kept in sync with past musters which included sporting, obstacles, trail and desensitisation. We are looking forward to holding musters in the New Year so keep an eye out on our Facebook pages and website.

MYCOTOXIN DANGERS

Fungi (moulds) can produce toxins (called mycotoxins) that are harmful to vertebrate animals. Around 300 mycotoxins are currently identified, and it's certain that many more are present in nature.

Horses can be exposed to mycotoxins in their feed as well as bedding. A warm, moist environment is ideal for mould reproduction. Plants in the field may be more susceptible to mycotoxin contamination after drought when rains and temperatures produce a conducive environment on already stressed plants.

These plants and others are renowned for causing photosynthesisation, signs are sunburn and blistering on pink skin on faces and pasterns (generic term, greasy heel or mud fever). When an animal consumes a plant or chemical containing these pigments (e.g., polyphenolic), the pigments circulate to the skin where they are exposed to UV light, fluoresce and cause oxidative injury to the cells of the skin. Liver damage in a horse might not be noticed until the animal develops photosensitisation.

The conditions which favour the growth of mycotoxins are humidity in the feed between 10 and 20%, relative atmospheric humidity greater than 70%, temperature above 20 degrees Celsius and the availability of oxygen. The toxins themselves persist, even if the fungi which produced them are destroyed.

South East Queensland coming into a wet summer after over 2 years of drought currently has the perfect storm of conditions for toxins to flourish.

Binding agents

Binding agents are relatively new products that can be fed to reduce the harmful effects of mycotoxin ingestion. They work by binding the mycotoxin in the gut so that it cannot be absorbed into the blood, rendering the toxin harmless as it passes through the gastrointestinal tract and out in the feces. Binding agents are made of some clays and the cell walls of yeast. An effective toxin binder is Mycosorb A+

Toxic weeds

Some weeds in hay can be toxic to horses. Many toxic weeds that are unpalatable to a horse in the pasture are more palatable in the dry form. Horses fed limited forage are more likely to eat toxic weeds in their hay.

Feed Room Tips

Grain should be stored in ways that reduce the risk of spoilage, contamination and infiltration by rodents, wildlife and hungry horses. The feed room should be clean and secure from horses, rodents, possums, birds and other animals that could potentially spread disease.

Supplements and drugs should be correctly and fully labelled with clear directions. Drugs should be stored according to the directions and away from food and drinks. Expiration dates should be followed. Medications that could potentially be used by humans (tranquilizers, etc.) should be stored in a secure area away from the public.

Grain bins should be clean and dry and allow for some air circulation. Airtight storage containers such as an old freezer will cause feed to spoil quickly. Bins should be emptied of feed before new feed is added.

Reducing risks of toxins in the feed room

Here are some guidelines to reduce risks of toxin exposure in your horse's feed:

- 1. Store hay and grain in a dry, cool location with proper ventilation.
- 2. Feed grain within 3 weeks of purchase or storage.
- 3. Clean feed troughs often.
- 4. Inspect feed visually and by smelling before every feeding.
- 5. Buy hay and grain from a reputable supply source that is familiar with the equine feed industry.
- 6. Avoid feeding horses with livestock where exposure to silage is likely.
 - 7. If a horse shows any symptoms of toxicity, immediately remove the feed source from all horses exposed until the cause of the symptoms is identified and use Mycosorb A+ to help provide a buffer to get rid of the toxins from the horses system.

DAY 1: The Engagement Zone



Discover how to engage your horse with learning, hold its attention, stop shying and spooking, and work in a soft, round outline.

Participants will learn 'give to the bit', 'hips to the fence', 'shoulder control' and 'stops' and build on these skills if already established. The clinic is suitable for horses that are being ridden with walk, trot and canter as well as horses that are not yet under saddle as much of the work can be done from the ground. If your horse is newly off-the-track, don't worry, you can still achieve a huge amount in this clinic.

DAY 2: Day 1 Review & Long-Reining



Long-reining is a very useful training tool. In this clinic you will teach your horse to long-rein in a calm and safe environment. Longreining is suitable for horses that are already going under saddle and those that aren't. It's a great place to improve your horse's self-carriage, build its top-line muscle and work on your transitions. The horses must have 'give to the bit' established before attending this clinic and for those unstarted horses, they will need to have been habituated to wearing a girth, which most of vour OTTs will have been.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Membership with SAQ runs from the 1st of October to the following 30th of September of a given year. If you need to renew your SAQ Membership, a renewal form is included later in this newsletter.

SAQ Membership is classified as one of the following categories:

JUNIOR MEMBER – a child under 18 years of age. A Junior member is eligible to register a gelding, filly or mare in their name and to participate in the SAQ Annual Awards and National High Point Competition, but is not eligible to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

SINGLE MEMBER – a person 18 years or older. A Single member is eligible to register a horse in their name, participate in the SAQ Annual Awards and National High Point Competition, nominate for Committee membership and to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP – parents/partners and children (by birth, legally adopted, legally fostered) residing at the same address and where the child / children are under the age of 18 years. A Family can register horses in the family or individual name, participate in the SAQ awards and National High Points Competition, nominate adult family members to the Committee and have two (2) votes on issues pertaining to the running of the Association. Members of a family who are 18 years or over, either living at home or residing elsewhere, must secure individual membership(s) in order to register a horse in their name, purchase a Performance Card, nominate for Committee membership and to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association.

ASSOCIATE MEMBER – a person who wishes to join the SAQ as a means of supporting the work of the Association but who does not wish to register a horse, participate in the SAQ Annual Awards or National High Point Competition.

An Associate Member is also not eligible to vote on issues pertaining to the running of the Association. However, an Associate Member is allowed to participate at two (2) SAQ events for the price of a member and is insured for these events with the SAQ.
